

WHAT IS OPEN ACCESS?



Open access (OA) is a publishing movement aimed at making research freely available online

Movement in higher education


Any kind of digital content can be OA

Publication

- Available online to all
- Free of charge
- Free of most copyright and licensing restrictions
- Deposited, immediately, in full and in a suitable electronic form

WHAT IS OPEN ACCESS PUBLISHING?


Open Access (OA) Publishing is a publishing model whereby scholarly journals, articles and books are published online with no or minimal restrictions on access and reuse.

Researchers should understand their copyright options before publishing

AUTHOR'S RIGHTS

Before transferring copyright, authors should

- Read and understand the copyright agreements they sign with publishers
- Consider including an appendix/addendum to ensure certain rights to reuse and share their work

AUTHOR'S RIGHTS — COPYRIGHT TRANSFER

Transferring copyrights do not need to be all or nothing

When signing an agreement with a publisher the author may:

 Transfer all of his rights to the publisher

 Transfer the copyright to the publisher but retain certain rights Retain all of his rights and license the rights to the publisher



AUTHOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES

Publish & Preserve your Paper

Author must always negotiates his rights with the publisher and stress on getting a permission to publish in an institutional repository whenever possible

AUTHOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES

Establish a Researcher Identity: Create your ORCID ID as an AUB Affiliate

to identify yourself as a researcher and to create a Researcher Identity (ID)

What is ORCID ID?

Persistent Digital Identifier

It is yours throughout your career

You can control when and where to use you ORCID ID

Why Register?

Avoid name ambiguity, distinguish yourself & assure that your work is attributed to you

Enhance author/work discovery and improve research visibility


Majority of journal publishers and funders are increasingly requiring authors to provide ORCID ID

Create your ORCID ID as an AUB Affiliate

First time user?

Follow the below steps to create your **ORCID** AUB institutional account.

- 1. Access ORCID
- 2. Choose Institutional account
- 3. Look for American University of Beirut & click on it
- 4. Log-in with your AUBNet account credentials
- 5. Register and create a new account
- Click on "Authorize" to give your institution permission to access your profile.

N.B: keep the checkbox "Allow this permission until I revoke it" selected.

WHY PUBLISH IN OPEN ACCESS?

Open Access Publishing may lead to

- Increased visibility, exposure, usage, and impact of research
- Expended readership
- Greater citation rates

Some misconceptions about Open Access Publishing

- OA journals are not of good quality or can be considered 'predatory'
- OA works are not copyrighted
- •OA journals do not have peer review
- OA publishers charges fees to publish

VETTING OPEN ACCESS JOURNALS

Before submitting manuscripts to open access journals, researchers should at least:

- Check if the journal is indexed in <u>DOAJ Directory of Open Access</u>
 <u>Journals</u>
- Learn about Open Access and Self-Archiving copyright policies
- Check if the journal is compliant with the funders policies
- Check if the journal is indexed in reputable databases such as <u>JSTOR</u>, <u>Web of Science</u>, <u>Scopus</u>, <u>PubMed</u> and <u>UlrichsWeb</u>
- Try to avoid predatory journals. Check Beall's List.

VETTING OPEN ACCESS JOURNALS

Before submitting manuscripts to open access journals, researchers should at least:

- •Check if the journal has an <u>ISSN number</u>, <u>Impact factor</u>, is a member of <u>COPE (Committee of Publishing Ethics)</u>
- •Make sure that the publisher is a member of a reputable industry organization such as <u>Open Access Scholarly Publishers Association</u> or the <u>Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE)</u>
- •Know who support the cost of publishing? Is there an article processing charge to pay for open access?

HOW MUCH DO JOURNALS CHARGE?




Eigenfactor Index of Open Access Fees

- Article Processing Charges (APCs)
- APCs in lieu of subscription fees
- Journal APCs vary greatly.
 - $$0 \rightarrow 3000 or more

Eigenfactor Index of Open Access Fees




Selecting an Open Access Journal

In order to select a suitable open access journal in which to publish, it can be helpful to understand what it is that you are paying for with your publication fees. In this context, we find it useful to think about the economics of scholarly publishing.


IDENTIFYING OA JOURNALS WITH NO APCS

It centralizes, facilitates and encourages the preservation, exploration, dissemination, promotion and use of the University's academic and research activities using open access publishing model.


- The main goal of this repository is to collect, publish and preserve research publications produced by scholars at AUB.
- AUB academic researchers and other AUB communities are encouraged to deposit research-oriented publications in this repository.
- Why deposit content? To increase visibility and citation rates of AUB research publications and to digitally preserve AUB research and scholarly work.
- Submission formats are: text, image, audio and video.

OPEN ACCESS REPOSITORY @ AUB /DATA

Data sharing is increasingly important in research and now often mandated by funding agencies.

AUB Data Bank offers long-term storage for scholarly output, more specifically Research Data. AUB researchers can upload their published or unpublished datasets to AUB databank.





ADVANTAGES

- Increase visibility and citation
- Easier access to information for anyone
- Open Access articles are published sooner than articles in non-Open Access journals
- Open Access articles reach broader audiences than articles in non-Open Access journals

DISADVANTAGES

- High quality open access journals did not establish the same reputation as traditional journals
- Not cheaper than the tradition publication
- Predatory open access journals try to mislead author



PREDATORY JOURNALS

Predatory journals are journals that charge publication fees to authors without providing legitimate peer review services prior to publication.

Evaluating Predatory Journals

JOURNAL WEBSITE

- Spelling & grammatical errors
- Broad journal scope
- No "About Us" page
- Insufficient contact information
- False metrics & indexing claims
- Street address questionable for business (search Google Maps street view)






PUBLISHED ARTICLES

- Few or no published articles available
- Numerous articles by same author(s)
- Inappropriate article titles & abstracts
- Articles aren't well researched
- Ask authors about experience with journal

EDITORIAL BOARD

- Editorial board not listed on website
- Editors aren't recognized experts in field
- Names used without knowledge or permission
- Editors have no or fake credentials
- Ask editors about experience with journal





UNSOLICITED E-MAIL INVITATIONS

- E-mail invitation to publish or review
- Poorly written (awkward or unprofessional language)
- Spelling or grammatical errors
- Filled with flattery

RAPID PUBLICATION & UNCLEAR FEES

- Promise of rapid publication
- Unclear or loose peer review process
- Unclear fee structure
- Insufficient "Instructions for Authors"
- Author fees aren't comparable with reputable journals



RED FLAGS

- ✓ E-mailed Invitations to Submit an Article
- √ Journal's Name Suspiciously Similar to a Prominent Journal in the Field
- ✓ Misleading Geographic Information in the Title
- ✓ Outdated or Unprofessional Website Appearance
- ✓ Broad Aim & Scope
- **✓ Insufficient Contact Information**
- √Lack of Editors or Editorial Board
- ✓ Editors with No or False Academic Credentials

RED FLAGS

- ✓ Editors with No or False Academic Credentials
- **✓ Unclear Author Fee Structures**
- **✓** Bogus Impact Factors
- **✓Invented Metrics**
- **√** False Index Claims
- **✓ Peer Review Process**
- √"Instructions for Authors" Information is Unavailable
- √ Manuscripts Submitted via E-mail

RED FLAGS

- **✓ Evaluate Published Articles**
- √ Publisher has a Negative Reputation
- ✓ Digital Preservation Information is Lacking or Inadequate
- **√No Retraction Policy**
- √ Copyright Information is Lacking
- **√No ISSN**
- **√Use Common Sense**

HOW TO SPOT PREDATORY JOURNALS?

Check the following tools or databases:

Look for the journal in Ulrichweb Directory, JCR, Citescore


Check if indexed in DOAJ, Web of Science, Scopus, Medline


Check if listed in Beall's list of predatory journals

Check if the publisher is a member of recognized professional organizations that commit to best practices in publishing, such as the

- ✓ Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE)
- √ International Association of Scientific, Technical, & Medical Publishers (STM)
- ✓ Open Access Scholarly Publishers Association (OASPA)
