
A Trip to Save the Earth!

Rami first met Linda when her parents just moved from Syria to his building in Ashrafieh.



"The first important thing we can do to save Earth is to start using the 3 R's", said Dani. "The what?!", asked Rami confused.


"The 3 R's stand for Reuse, Reduce, Recycle", Dani explained, "When you reuse, it means you use the same object, but in a different way than it was originally used."




"Exactly kids, all these are good examples of reusing" said Dani.
