- Her parents accepted under the condition that the house must stay clean and the party must be held under their supervision. Elsa accepted and was very happy.






Next day, Elsa's parents received an invitation card to attend an honoring ceremony at work. The invitation was from their boss, so they had to go.

Elsa learned her lesson and decided not to ever break her parents' rules.


