"Open data is data that can be freely used, re-used and redistributed by anyone - subject only, at most, to the requirement to attribute and share alike."


Open Data Handbook

Available and Accessible

Data is Open when Reusable

Allows for international participation

Open vs FAIR data



FAIR Data Principles



FINDABLE

Data has rich metadata and unique identifier



ACCESSIBLE

Data can be easily downloaded or used by using standard protocols



INTEROPERABLE

Metadata use an accessible and standard language



REUSABLE

Data is well-described and provides clear usage of licences

Why Open Data?



ENCOURAGES:

Reuse of datasets and discourages duplication of effort

Proper management of data

Transparency and **reproducibility** of research



IMPROVES:

Discoverability/visibility of datasets **Attribution** to original data producers and curators
